PRO CORDA BAROQUE at Leiston Abbey 22 - 26 August 2019



Immerse yourself in the rich repertoire of 18th-century chamber music at the Pro Corda Baroque course! Concentrating on chamber music with period instruments (A 415), the course also includes performances, daily instrumental classes with specialist baroque musicians, continuo coaching, baroque orchestra, baroque dance insight sessions and optional early morning yoga, all in the beautiful surroundings of a heritage site, in a friendly and supportive atmosphere.

Repertoire is carefully chosen to give valuable experience to established historical players, whilst providing a fantastic opportunity for newcomers to baroque instruments to gain intensive training and a fundamental grounding in baroque style.

We also welcome modern instrumentalists and encourage them to experiment with baroque instruments/ bows. Advanced pianists and organists are offered coaching in figured bass and obbligato harpsichord.
